A HISTORY OF THE BANK - TEN DECADES OF DEDICATION

The bank, the Kumbakonam Bank Ltd., as it was then called - was founded in the year 1904 by a dedicated band of prominent citizens of Kumbakonam, led by Sri Santhanam Aiyer. The first Memorandum of Association was signed by twenty devoted and prominent citizens of Kumbakonam including Sarvashri R.Santhanam Iyer, S.Krishna Iyer, V.Krishnaswami Iyengar and T.S.Raghavachariar. The first Articles of Association provided for an Agent to be in charge of the Bank and Shri T.S.Raghavachariar was the First Agent of the Bank.

In those days, it was a boon to the people of the locality to have in their midst a bank of their own to cater to their needs. With branches in the rural centres in the area, the bank had a steady and stable growth.

As time passed on and changes took place in the banking industry, a need was felt for a wholetime executive to run the affairs of the bank. It was in this context, Sri S. Mahalinga Aiyer came on the scene and took over as whole time Managing Director of the bank in the year 1926. An influential team of directors was drafted into the Board to guide the Managing Director in running the administration. Prominent among those were: R. Kandaswami Moopanaar, A.V. Narayanaswami Pillai, N. Dasarathy, K. Balasubramania Aiyer (Chennai), K. Chandrasekaran (Chennai), Dr.R. Mahalingam and others.

The first step, Sri. Mahalinga Aiyer took was to streamline the administration of the bank and to enforce discipline all round. More branches were opened and the bank functioned with great efficiency and earned sizeable profit. The bank in the beginning preferred the role of a regional bank and slowly but steadily built for itself a place in the Delta District of Thanjavur. The first branch of the Bank was opened at Mannargudi on 24th January 1930. Thereafter, branches were opened at Nagapatnam, Sannanallur, Ayyampet, Tirukattupalli, Tiruvarur, Manapparai, Mayuram and Porayar within a span of twentyfive years. The Bank was included in the Second Schedule of Reserve Bank of India Act of 1934, on 22nd March 1945.

The Bank celebrated its Golden Jubilee on 14th November, 1954 at Kumbakonam under the Presidentship of Shri. C.R. Srinivasan, Editor, Swadesamitran' & Director, Reserve Bank of India.

In the year 1957, the bank took over the assets and liabilities of the Commonwealth Bank Ltd., and in the process, annexed to its own their branch at Valangaiman. The directors on the Board of the Commonwealth Bank Ltd., at that time were T.S. Rajagopala Aiyangar (TSR) Dr. V.R. Murthy (both former Municipal Chairmen) and N. Subramania Aiyer of Serukalathur.

Sri S. Mahalinga Aiyer identified himself with the bank and its interests so closely that he came to be known as "Bank Mahalinga Aiyer". Besides being a



shrewd lawyer, Sri Mahalinga Aiyer proved himself to be an astute banker too, as evident from various instances in his administration.

Sri S. Mahalinga Aiyer held sway over the bank for a long spell of over three decades until 1963, when he relinquished office on grounds of health.

In the wake of the retirement of Sri Mahalinga Aiyer, Sri R. Venkataramani Aiyer, also a lawyer and senior Director of the bank, was elected to be a part time Chairman of the bank. During his brief tenure, he got the bank's branch opened at T. Nagar (Chennai) which later developed into a nerve centre among the city branches with a sprawling building of its own. Earlier in 1965, under the auspices of Reserve Bank of India, the amalgamation of the bank with City Forward Bank Ltd. and Union Bank Ltd., was put through, resulting in the change of nomenclature of the bank as "The Kumbakonam City Union Bank Ltd." The directors at that time on the Board of the City Forward Bank Ltd., were R. Subramania Aiyer (Managing Director), G.S. Swaminatha Chettiar, M.V. Balarama Aiyer, K.S. Venkatarama Aiyer of Sengalipuram and T.D. Govindaswami Pillai of Tirupanandal while the Union Bank Ltd., was represented by K. Sarangapani Ayyangar, V.S. Seshappier.

As a result, the bank got an addition of five branches to its own, viz. Aduthurai, Kuttalam, Koradachery, Tirupanandal and Nannilam - all belonging to the City Forward Bank Ltd., while the Union Bank Ltd., had none except its Head Office at Kumbakonam.

Following the retirement of Sri R. Venkataramani Aiyer, the bank was able to acquire the services of Sri O.R. Srinivasan, retired Dy. Chief Officer of Reserve Bank of India, to head the bank as its Chairman in May 1969. This event proved to be a turning point in the annals of the Bank. Shri. R.Kuppabhattan, a former Senior Officer of the Indian Bank was appointed as Secretary in June, 1969, and he too played a major role in streamlining the administration of the Bank. Under the new Management the Branch expansion got a fresh impetus and branches were opened at Eravancheri, Sembanarkoil, Tiruchirapalli, Madurai, Thanjavur, Dindigul, Keelapalur, Tirumakkottai, Kottur, Tiruvarur Town and Coimbatore during the period from March, 1968 to August, 1973.

In April, 1974 the bank secured the services of Shri.K.Srinivasan, another former Senior Officer of Reserve Bank of India as its Secretary. At that time a young Chartered Accountant from Thippirajapuram a village near Kumbakonam, Shri.V.Narayanan was appointed as Assistant Secretary of the Bank. During the period ended 31-12-1976 Branches were opened at Periyakulam, Mandaveli [Madras], Pattukkottai, Triplicane [Madras], Cuddalore, Pudukkottai, Chidambaram and Salem.

Sri O.R. Srinivasan embarked upon a vigorous programme of branch expansion and brought about several structural changes in the administrative sphere. His notable contribution to the bank was the construction of a palatial and imposing building with all modern conveniences; and it majestically stands today as a monument to the memory of O.R. Srinivasan. The building was



inaugurated in 1973 by the Justice K.S. Venkataraman, in the presence of distinguished gathering including Kumararaja Sri. M.A. Muthiah Chettiar.

Sri O.R. Srinivasan led the bank successfully for nearly eight years and laid down office in 1977. Thereupon, Sri. K. Srinivasan, also a retired Dy. Chief Officer of Reserve Bank of India and who was earlier holding the post of Secretary from 1974, took over as Chairman. Sri K. Srinivasan conducted the affairs of the bank with judicious care on the path laid down by his illustrious predecessors.

The bank celebrated its Platinum Jubilee on 9th December, 1979 at Kumbakonam with Dr. Rajah Sir M.A. Muthiah Chettiar, Shri. G. Rengasamy Moopnar, Shri. Ko. Si. Mani and Shri. M.V. Arunachalam as Guests of Honour in a most fitting manner at a spectacular function marked by a special programme of Carnatic music by Smt. M.S. Subbulakshmi.

After a successful tenure, Sri K. Srinivasan laid down office in the year 1980. Following this, Sri V. Narayanan, B.Com., A.C.A., who had already a fairly long innings as Secretary in the bank was inducted into the office of Chairman in 1980. His assumption of office as Chairman has proved to be a turning point in the history of the bank

His prior experience in the bank as Secretary had stood him in good stead in fitting himself into the new office and in carrying out the various programmes with perfect ease.

Mention must also be made about the contributions of Shri C. Govindan, Assistant

General Manager and also Director, who was particularly instrumental in fostering the cordial relationship within the bank.

In the process of the development activities, the Chairman was ably assisted by Shri K. Venkataraman, who was the Chief General Manager. Shri K. Venkataraman had also brought in a number of changes and ensured sound administration.

The first branch outside the state of Tamilnadu was opened at Sultanpet, Bangalore in Karnataka in September, 1980.

Branches were also opened at the twin cities of Hyderabad and Secunderabad in Andhrapradesh.

In 1987, in deference to the wishes of the shareholders, customers and the general public alike, the bank's name was changed as City Union Bank Ltd. in order to shed its regional image and this has given rise to branch expansion and a large number of branches has sprung up in the recent past covering almost all the States and Metropolitan cities. Today, the network of branches has increased to 137 branches.

With a view to sharpen the skills of the personnel to handle the business, the bank has opened its own staff college on 21st August 1989 under the guidance of Shri V. Subramaniam, a retired principal of Reserve Bank of India staff college. He had also provided guidance in the introduction of forex business in the bank. When the forex business was initially introduced. Shri V. Subramanyam assisted in getting necessary training for the personnel of the bank.



As a result of Chairman's tenacious efforts, Reserve Bank has granted licence to the bank to deal in foreign exchange, and accordingly the "International Banking Division" has been set up with effect from October 1990. This is presently housed in the Mount Road (Chennai) branch of the bank and is functioning on progressive lines. In the month of June 1998, the Bank came out with a public issue for an amount aggregating to Rs.21 crores. Its present paid-up capital is Rs.24crores. The bank has arranged for its shares to be listed on the Madras Stock Exchange, Mumbai Stock Exchange and National Stock Exchange. It is a matter of gratification that the bank's shares are being quoted at appreciable rates.

The bank has introduced computerisation in the year 1990 and as of now all the Branches have been computerised. The Bank is having Six on-site ATMs.

To provide value added services, the Bank has entered into Memoranda of Understanding with Life Insurance Corporation of India and National Insurance Company Limited for selling insurance products. The bank has been accorded licence by Insurance Regulatory Authority of India [IRDA] to act as Corporate Agent.

The Bank has entered into an agreement with Tata Consultancy Services Limited for introducing Core Banking Solution.

The bank has also entered into a franchise agreement for the Money Transfer Service Scheme of M/s Western Union Financial Services Inc., U.S.A. with their agents in India M/s AFL Pvt. Limited.

The Bank's CENTENARY CELEBRATIONS were inaugurated on 27th December, 2003 at the Saraswathi Patasala Girl's Higher Secondary School Grounds, Kumbakonam under the Chairmanship of Shri.V. Narayanan with Shri. R.Venkataraman, Former President of India, Dr. AR. Lakshmanan, Judge, Supreme Court, New Delhi and Shri. N. Rengachari, Retired Chairman, IRDA & Advisor to the Government of Andhra Pradesh as distinguished Guests.

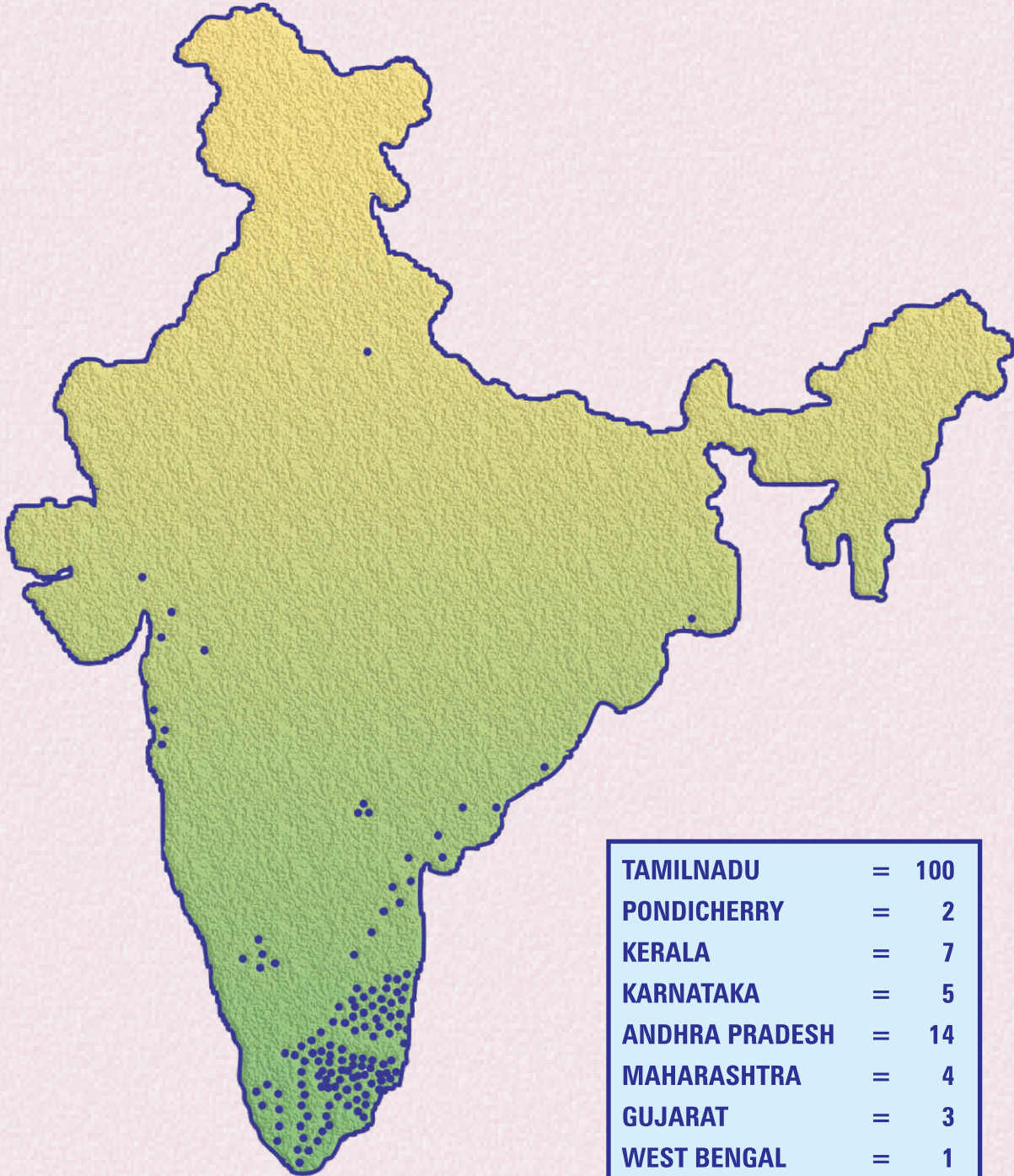
